**WARNER MUSIC CANADA TO DISTRIBUTE
THE 2009 JUNO AWARDS COMPILATION ALBUM
Release date set for March 10, 2009**

On March 10, 2009 Warner Music Canada will release *The 2009 JUNO Awards* compilation album. The project is a joint venture between Canada's four major labels (EMI Music Canada Inc., Sony Music Entertainment Canada Inc., Universal Canada and Warner Music Canada) and The Canadian Academy of Recording Arts and Sciences (CARAS).

The 2009 JUNO Awards compilation album is a non-profit package with proceeds going to MusiCounts, Canada's music education charity associated with CARAS. MusiCounts is dedicated to helping schools sustain their music programs through Band Aid musical instrument grants and scholarships and by honouring extraordinary music teachers. Since 2003 the annual JUNO Awards nominees compilation albums have sold close to a quarter of a million copies in Canada.

"Much of the Canadian music released in the past year was recognized internationally and *The 2009 JUNO Awards* compilation is just a small taste of this country's wonderfully diverse music scene," said Warner Music Canada President Steve Kane. "That this series of albums has been so successful is proof positive of the public's support of homegrown talent. That the proceeds help MusiCounts is one way of assuring that our culture has an opportunity to grow."

Warner Music Canada's comedy star Russell Peters returns to host The 2009 JUNO Awards, Canada's Music Awards, which will be broadcast on CTV on Sunday, March 29 from General Motors Place in Vancouver, B.C.

Since CTV joined forces with CARAS in 2002, *The JUNO Awards* has been broadcast from St. John's (2002), Ottawa (2003), Edmonton (2004), Winnipeg (2005), Halifax (2006), Saskatoon (2007) and Calgary (2008). In April 2008, 1.45 million Canadians watched Russell Peters host *The 2008 JUNO Awards*, making it the second most-watched *JUNO Awards* broadcast ever on CTV. Previous hosts of The JUNO Awards include Nelly Furtado (2007), Pamela Anderson (2006), Brent Butt (2005), Alanis Morissette (2004), Shania Twain (2003) and Barenaked Ladies (2002).
