TORONTO – At a press conference announcing the 2018 JUNO Award nominations, The Canadian Academy of Recording Arts and Sciences (CARAS) and CBC announced today that critically-acclaimed R&B and soul performer [Daniel Caesar](#), JUNO Award-winning pop-rock sensation [Hedley](#), and singer-songwriter [Jessie Reyez](#), who is nominated for an impressive four JUNO Awards, are all set to perform on **The 2018 JUNO Awards Broadcast**. Canada's music award show will air live from the [Rogers Arena](#) in Vancouver on **Sunday, March 25** on CBC, CBC Radio and cbcmusic.ca/junos.

Two-time JUNO Award-winners, Hedley, are nominated for an incredible three awards this year including JUNO Fan Choice*, Group of the Year* and Pop Album of the Year, while 2017 JUNO Award nominee Daniel Caesar secured two nominations for Artist of the Year* and R&B/Soul Recording of the Year.
